- Each abstract should follow the subheadings below :

 - Methods
 - Authors and institutions
 - Results
 - Presenting author and email
 - Conclusion
 - Background
 - Keywords (not more that five)
- Objectives
- Author(s) name(s) and institution(s).
 Do not include degrees of professional titles. A maximum of four (4) authors can be listed.
- Underline the name of the presenting authors.
- Leave one line between the title/author/ institution and the body of the abstract.
- Text must be typed single-space, with only the left margin justified. Graphs, table and illustrations cannot be included in the abstract.
- Abstract should not be more than 250 words.
